Throughout the conference she explained to me how Alex had been struggling for food, accommodation and school tuition, as she continued speaking to me I knew I had to do something. I approached Alex and began speaking to him; it was within fifteen minutes that I invited him to KCC. We spent the following weeks pursuing court orders that would allow him to legally stay at KCC permanently, to our success it was agreed Alex could live at the centre.

Despite the good news, it was a difficult transition for Alex within the next few months that were to follow. He enjoyed being a part of KCC but struggled to process his past and previous lack of parenting, despite these struggles Alex did however develop a strong faith in Christ and within weeks began leading others in praise and worship. He found a passion for playing and writing

children have big dreams to be doctors and have bright futures; this is something we could only have hoped, when we first took abandoned children to our centre.

Juliet has a great passion for babies, when Timothy and Tegan arrived at the centre she took them in at only 2 days old, now they are four years, healthy, with wonderful social skills and have just started school this year. Whenever babies are brought to us by social services or hospitals she fights for them and pours her mother's heart into their lives, which inevitably causes these babies to grow into healthy and more importantly happy children. A perfect example of this is Stephan, a baby who was abandoned at hospital and moved into KCC's Hope House at only one month. Now one and a half years on he has a family and is a very loved and happy baby.
